<u>Ice Breaker:</u> This week we talked about how Jesus shows quiet strength—strength that's steady, gentle, and confident without being aggressive.

 Q1: When you think about "quiet power," what examples come to mind—either from someone you know or something you've seen in media?

Isaiah 42 was written to people living in exile. As believers, we also live as "exiles" in a world that isn't our true home.

 Q2: How does the picture of Jesus bringing comfort and courage to exiles personally resonate with you?

Read Isaiah 42:1-9 together. Israel, its kings, and humanity as a whole continually failed at the servant role.

- Q3: Where do you see yourself in that pattern of failed "servanthood"?
- Q4: What emotions surface when you consider that Jesus succeeded where you can't?

Isaiah says the Servant won't break a bruised reed or snuff out a smoldering wick (v.3).

- Q5: Where are you feeling weak or weary right now—and how might the Spirit be inviting you to receive Jesus's tender care?
- Q6: Who in your life seems bruised, fragile, or close to burning out—and what might it look like to show them Christlike gentleness this season?

God warns Israel in v.8 not to misattribute rescue or hope to anything other than Him.

- Q7: What are some modern idols you're tempted to look to for security
 (success, politics, comfort, appearance, relationships, self-sufficiency, etc.)?
- Q8: How can you intentionally re-center your trust on God this week?

We serve a God who declares the end of the story from the beginning!

- Q9: What is one example of something God has done in your past that gives you hope for the future?
- Q10: Are there any specific areas of discouragement you'd like the group to pray over?

Take a few minutes to encourage each other, and spend some time in prayer together! Upcoming Scripture: Isaiah 52:7-10; 52:13-53:12
