1 John 3:14-24

Questions:

- Our world is full of conditional love and a fundamental misunderstanding of love in general.
 - What are some worldly or cultural examples of conditional love?
- Read 1 John 3:14-24. This week's sermon was all about unconditional love! Aside from Jesus, think of a time when you experienced this kind of love.
 - How did you know that the love you were being shown in that moment was unconditional? Tell your group about it!

- Verse 16 calls us to "lay down our lives for the brothers". We can be guilty of writing this off as an overstatement.
 - In our day-to-day walk, laying down our lives often looks like laying down our moments. What makes this so challenging for you?
- In the church, it has become cliche to say, "We're doing life together", while forsaking any real relational intimacy.
 - How did this week's sermon inspire you to take "doing life together" to the next level?
- Reflect on the quote, "There is nothing you could ever do to make me stop loving you." This mindset is a mark of the godly community we are aiming for.
 - o Who in your life, group, or Christian community needs to hear that quote?
 - What are some practical ways that you could live out that idea this week?
- This week's passage calls us to love others the way that Jesus loves us!
 - How does the Gospel give you assurance even when you don't love others perfectly?
- Take a moment to consider the following challenge: "We are a people who share each other's pain, even when we have caused it".
 - Have you ever seen this challenge lived out? Share!
 - Where do you need to grow spiritually in order to rise to this challenge?
