<u>Ice Breaker:</u> Psalm 118 helped the people of God remember their shared history.

 Q1: What's one memory from our small group that always makes you smile—or reminds you why this group matters to you?

Read Psalm 118. It reminds us that God is our refuge—even when fear creeps in.

Q2: Is there something in your life right now where fear is trying to take over,
 but you sense God is inviting you to trust Him instead?

When we remember God's steadfast love, we realize how easy it is to lean on other things instead of Him.

 Q3: What are some things you tend to turn to for comfort or control when you're afraid—before turning to God? Why do you think that is? Reflecting on the Lord's steadfast love also helps us to reframe our struggles.

- Q4: Think about where it's hard for you to trust God right now. What do you think "taking refuge in the Lord" might look like in that situation?
- Q5: Can you think of any "stones of remembrance" in your life—times God
 clearly showed up for you—that give you hope today?

The Psalmist also talks about experiencing God's faithfulness even through discipline.

- Q6: How do you usually recognize when God might be disciplining or shaping you? How do you typically react to it?
- Q7: How have tough seasons in the past brought about real growth in your faith today?

The ultimate picture of God's love is Jesus—and Psalm 118 may have been on His lips before going to the cross.

- Q8: How does it strike you to think that Jesus may have sung this Psalm right before He was betrayed?
- Q9: If Jesus could worship in a moment like that, so can we! What would it look like for you to respond with praise this week—right where you are, even if it's hard?

Take a few minutes to encourage each other and spend some time in prayer together!
