Introduction

Living in Faithfulness to Our Redeemer (Exodus 20:3).

The first commandment calls redeemed people to faithfulness.

There are a number of gods that we encounter today just as there were for the children of Israel as they entered the promised land. Each of these gods fight for our devotion.
