Biblical Truth

Definition: Using the unchanging word of God as the authority for Godly living (as we lead others to the joy of Jesus Christ).

Demonstrated by:

- Bible classes, Sunday school, small groups
- Scripture readings during services
- Sermons which expound on the scripture readings
- Confession and creeds
- Scripture is used as a test to keep from following rapidly changing societal norms

Christ-Centered/Christocentric

Definition: The placing of Christ at the center of one's thought, actions, and/or theological system.

Demonstrated by:

- Praying together in Christ's name
- Worship in Christ's name
- Fellowship in Christ's name
- Ministry in Christ's name

Scriptural Support:

Colossians 2:2-3 "that their hearts may be encouraged, being knit together in love, to reach all the riches of full assurance of understanding and the knowledge of God's mystery, which is Christ, in whom are hidden all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge."

Ephesians 2:20-22 "built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Christ Jesus himself being the cornerstone, in whom the whole structure, being joined together, grows into a holy temple in the Lord. In him you also are being built together into a dwelling place for God by the Spirit."

Matthew 21:42 "Jesus said to them, "Have you never read in the Scriptures: "'The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone; this was the Lord's doing, and it is marvelous in our eyes'?"

Lutheran Heritage

Definition: Intentionally teaching Lutheran heritage, which is grounded in scripture, to our children and others.

Demonstrated by:

- Continued adherence to the mission of the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod (LCMS)
- Endorse true, unchanging spiritual principles for God's authority for how we live
- Agreement with Christian doctrines found in Luther's Small Catechism and the Book of Concord
- Encouragement of scripture-based statements of faith to be recited at home and church
- Repetitive opportunities to remember, confess, and adhere to our beliefs in our triune God
- Support spiritual education of all ages to continually build understanding of God's instruction through scripture
- Nurture a saving faith through scripture, faith, and grace

Rich Tapestry of Worship

Definition: Receiving God's gifts of forgiveness, life, and salvation through liturgical worship (confessional and sacramental) marked by artistic excellence.

Demonstrated by:

- Creating a Hunger for God
- Sacred, Sincere, Substantial
- Faithfulness to Scripture, the Lutheran Confessions, and to those who came before from whom we received the faith
- An understanding that liturgy is defined in the Lutheran Confessions as "public service" in the sense that the proclamation of the Gospel and administration of the sacraments is God's service done on behalf of his people.
- An understanding that the liturgy is a teacher of the faith
- Reverence
- Orderliness
- An engaged, vibrantly singing and praying congregation
- Artistic beauty and technical excellence, edifying believers and unbelievers alike
- A focus on in-person worship, the saints gathered together
- We are the body of Christ

Scripture Support:

Psalm 29:2 "Ascribe to the LORD the glory due his name; worship the LORD in the splendor of holiness."

John 4:23 "But the hour is coming, and is now here, when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth, for the Father is seeking such people to worship him."

Psalm 130:4 "But with you there is forgiveness, that you may be feared."

Exodus 25-40--In the Old Testament, God locates His saving presence in the tabernacle, where He has promised to be found. Today, He locates His blessings of salvation for us in the Word and Sacraments of His Church. Note in these chapters the extensive detail of God's instructions for worship.

Romans 12:1 "I appeal to you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship."

Fellowship

Definition: The sharing of doctrine, Sacraments, and love cultivated by the Holy Spirit. Greek: koinonia, "sharing," "participation in a common thing." Christian fellowship has both a heavenly and an earthly dimension. Also, the support of fellow believers.

Demonstrated by:

- Commitment to the truth together
- Strong Friendships between members
- Celebration of the traditions that bind us together
- Intentional hospitality, individually and as a congregation
- Specific opportunities for groups to bond: Men, women, singles, & youth/children

Scripture Support:

2 Cor 13:14 "The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all."

Eph. 3:6 "This mystery is that the Gentiles are fellow heirs, members of the same body, and partakers of the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel."

Phil 3:10 "...that I may know him and the power of his resurrection, and may share his sufferings, becoming link him in his death..."

Prov 17:17 "A friend loves at all times, and a brother is born for adversity."

John 15:13 "Greater love has no one than this, that someone lay down his life for his friends."
