God often moves silently. Sometimes, it seems as if He does not move at all. While God is nowhere named in the entire book of Esther, the Holy Spirit reveals His intentional activity to the discerning reader. This message teaches us to look for the invisible hand of God who is frequently planting the seeds of His providence in the normal, unspectacular moments of our lives. On any typical day of the believer's life, God is silently, invisibly working on countless levels to accomplish His designs for us.

I. Providential Location: the right place (19)

"Now when the virgins were gathered together the second time, Mordecai was sitting at the king's gate."

II. Providential Oil: the right posture (20)

"Esther had not made known her kindred or her people, <u>as Mordecai had commanded her, for Esther obeyed Mordecai just as when she was brought up by him.</u>" Obedience and faithfulness tend to facilitate the work God sovereignly ordains

III. Providential Timing: the right process (21)

"In those days, <u>as Mordecai was sitting at the king's gate</u>, Bigthan and Teresh, two of the king's eunuchs, who guarded the threshold, became angry and sought to lay hands on King Ahasuerus."

IV. Providential Connection: the right people (22)

"And this came to the knowledge of Mordecai, and <u>he told it to Queen Esther, and Esther told the king in the</u> name of Mordecai."

V. Providential Detail: the right precision (23)

"When the affair was investigated and found to be so, the men were both hanged on the gallows. And it was recorded in the book of the chronicles in the presence of the king."

This little record-keeping entry would prove to be a major factor in events that followed!
