- I. Jesus Speaks as the Sovereign King (1)
 - A. He expects His messengers to speak what He speaks "To the angel of the church in Ephesus write..."
 - B. He expects all people to acknowledge His authority "The words of Him who holds the seven stars in his right hand..."
 - C. He expects His people to honor His presence "...who walks among the seven golden lampstands."
- II. Jesus Affirms as the Watchful Shepherd (2-3, 6)
 - A. They were industrious workers (2a) "I know your works, your toil and your patient endurance..."
 - B. They were doctrinally discerning (2b) "And how you cannot bear with those who are evil, but have tested those who call themselves apostles and are not, and found them to be false."
 - C. They were fortified in their faithfulness (3) "I know you are enduring patiently and bearing up for My name's sake, and you have not grown weary."
 - D. They were clear in where they stood (6) "...you hate the works of the Nicolaitans, which I also hate."

Ephesus was a stout, actively serving, courageous, loyal church positionally aligned with the mission of Jesus Christ

- III. Jesus Rebukes as the Discerning Lord (4-5)
 - A. Something which must be addressed by Christ (4) "But I have this against you, that you have abandoned the love you had at first."
 - B. Something which must be acknowledged by us (5a) "Remember therefore from where you have fallen..."
 - C. Something which must be activated (5b) "...repent, and do the works you did at first."
 - D. Something which must be avoided (5c) "If not, I will come to you and remove your lampstand from its place, unless you repent."
- IV. Jesus Motivates as the Welcoming Warrior (7)
 - A. A constant reality "He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches." Some will hear, some won't
 - B. A valid possibility "To the one who conquers..."
 - C. An unstoppable destiny "...I will grant to eat of the tree of life which is in the paradise of God."
