

I. The Reason Jesus Died (6)

- A. Our blind wanderings (6a) - “All we like sheep have gone astray;<sup>”</sup> **Incidental**
- B. Our rebellious hearts (6b) - “...we have turned - every one - to his own way;<sup>”</sup> **Intentional**
- C. Our inescapable depravity (6c) - “...and the LORD has laid on Him the iniquity of us all.”

II. The Way Jesus Died (7-9)

- A. He suffered in silence (7) - “He was oppressed, and He was afflicted, yet He opened not his mouth; like a lamb that is led to the slaughter, and like a sheep that before its shearers is silent, so He opened not His mouth.”
- B. He suffered rejection (8) - “By oppression and judgment He was taken away; and as for His generation, who considered that He was cut off out of the land of the living, stricken for the transgression of my people?”
- C. He suffered injustice (9) - “And they made His grave with the wicked and with a rich man in His death, although He had done no violence, and there was no deceit in His mouth.”

III. The Effect of Jesus Dying (10-11)

- A. Sacrificial death (10) - “Yet it was the will of the LORD to crush Him; He has put Him to grief; when His soul makes an offering for guilt, He shall see His offspring; He shall prolong His days; the will of the LORD shall prosper in His hand.”
- B. Perfect atonement (11) - “Out of the anguish of His soul He shall see and be satisfied; by His knowledge shall the righteous one, my servant, make many to be accounted righteous, and He shall bear their iniquities.”

IV. The Treasure from Jesus Dying (12)

- A. His inheritance for us (12a) - “Therefore I will divide Him a portion with the many, and He shall divide the spoil with the strong...”
- B. His identifying with us (12b) - “...because He poured out His soul to death and was numbered with the transgressors;”
- C. His intercession for us (12c) - “...yet He bore the sin of many, and makes intercession for the transgressors.”
