I. The Reason Jesus Died (6)
A. Our blind wanderings (6a) - "All we like sheep have gone astray;" Incidental
B. Our rebellious hearts (6b) - "...we have turned - every one - to his own way;" Intentional
C. Our inescapable depravity (6c) - "... and the LORD has laid on Him the iniquity of us all."
II. The Way Jesus Died (7-9)
A. He suffered in silence (7) - "He was oppressed, and He was afflicted, yet He opened not his mouth; like a lamb that is led to the slaughter, and like a sheep that before its shearers is silent, so He opened not His mouth."
B. He suffered rejection (8) - "By oppression and judgment He was taken away; and as for His generation, who considered that He was cut off out of the land of the living, stricken for the transgression of my people?"
C. He suffered injustice (9) - "And they made His grave with the wicked and with a rich man in His death, although He had done no violence, and there was no deceit in His mouth."
III. The Effect of Jesus Dying (10-11)
A. Sacrificial death (10) - "Yet it was the will of the LORD to crush Him; He has put Him to grief; when His soul makes an offering for guilt, He shall see His offspring; He shall prolong His days; the will of the LORD shall prosper in His hand."
B. Perfect atonement (11) - "Out of the anguish of His soul He shall see and be satisfied; by His knowledge shall the righteous one, my servant, make many to be accounted righteous, and He shall bear their iniquities."
IV. The Treasure from Jesus Dying (12)
A. His inheritance for us (12a) - "Therefore I will divide Him a portion with the many, and He shall divide the spoil with the strong..."
B. His identifying with us (12b) - "...because He poured out His soul to death and was numbered with the transgressors;"
C. His intercession for us (12c) - "... yet He bore the sin of many, and makes intercession for the transgressors."
