OPEN WITH VERSES 1-14

- I. Victory is Decreed But A Fight Is Required (1-5)
 - A. Reversals: what God delights in (1) "Now in the twelfth month, which is the month of Adar, on the thirteenth day of the same, when the king's command and edict were about to be carried out, on the very day when the enemies of the Jews hoped to gain the mastery over them, the reverse occurred: the Jews gained mastery over those who hated them."
 - B. Favor: what God can do (2-3) "The Jews gathered in their cities throughout all the provinces of King Ahasuerus to lay hands on those who sought their harm. And no one could stand against them, for the fear of them had fallen on all peoples.

 3 All the officials of the provinces and the satraps and the governors and the royal agents also helped the Jews, for the fear of Mordecai had fallen on them."
 - C. Elevation: what God offers (4) "For Mordecai was great in the king's house, and his fame spread throughout all the provinces, for the man Mordecai grew more and more powerful."
 - D. Justice: what God releases (5) "The Jews struck all their enemies with the sword, killing and destroying them, and did as they pleased to those who hated them."
- II. A Message Is Sent While Restraint Is Enacted (11-16)
 - A. Do not attack God's chosen people (11-12) "That very day the number of those killed in Susa the citadel was reported to the king. 12 And the king said to Queen Esther, "In Susa the citadel the Jews have killed and destroyed 500 men and also the ten sons of Haman. What then have they done in the rest of the king's provinces! Now what is your wish? It shall be granted you. And what further is your request? It shall be fulfilled."
 - B. Do not oppose God's appointed servant (13-14) "And Esther said, "If it please the king, let the Jews who are in Susa be allowed tomorrow also to do according to this day's edict. And <u>let the ten sons of Haman be hanged on the gallows</u>. 14 So the king commanded this to be done. A decree was issued in Susa, and <u>the ten sons of Haman were hanged</u>."

Haman's hatred for Mordecai resulted in his own death and the execution of his ten sons.

C. Do not profane God's advancement (15-16) - "The Jews who were in Susa gathered also on the fourteenth day of the month of Adar and they killed 300 men in Susa, <u>but they laid no hands on the plunder</u>. 16 Now the rest of the Jews who were in the king's provinces also gathered to defend their lives, and got relief from their enemies and killed 75,000 of those who hated them, <u>but they laid no hands on the plunder</u>."

III. A Holiday Is Established With Joy to be Released (16-22)

"This was on the thirteenth day of the month of Adar, and on the fourteenth day they rested and <u>made that a day of feasting and gladness</u>. 18 But the Jews who were in Susa gathered on the thirteenth day and on the fourteenth, and rested on the fifteenth day, <u>making that a day of feasting and gladness</u>. 19 Therefore the Jews of the villages, who live in the rural towns, hold the fourteenth day of the month of Adar as <u>a day for gladness and feasting</u>, as <u>a holiday</u>, and as <u>a day on which they send gifts of food to one another</u>. 20 And Mordecai recorded these things and sent letters to all the Jews who were in all the provinces of King Ahasuerus, both near and far, 21 obliging them to keep the fourteenth day of the month Adar and also the fifteenth day of the same, year by year, 22 as the days on which the Jews got relief from their enemies, and <u>as the month that had been turned for them from sorrow into gladness and from mourning into a holiday; that they should make them days of feasting and gladness, days for sending gifts of food to one another and gifts to the poor."</u>
