I. Jesus Corrects Our Natural Tribalism (49-50)

A. A need to retain the big picture (49a) - "John answered, "Master, we saw someone casting out demons in Your name..."

B. A need to refrain from our impulse (49b) - "...and we tried to stop him, because he does not follow with us."

C. A need to remain committed to humility (50) - "But Jesus said to him, "<u>Do not stop him, for the one who is not against</u> you is for you."

II. Jesus Exemplifies Our Need To Take Risks (51-52)

A. Intentionally stepping into sacrifice (51) - "When <u>the days drew near for Him to be taken up</u>, He set His face to go to Jerusalem."

B. Purposefully pushing cultural boundaries (52) - "And <u>He sent messengers</u> ahead of him, <u>who went and entered a</u> <u>village of the Samaritans</u>, to make preparations for Him."

**III. Jesus Challenges Our Judgmental Tendencies (53-56)** 

A. The sting of rejection arises (53) - "But the people did not receive Him, because His face was set toward Jerusalem."

B. The impulse for vengeance is stirred (54) - "And when His disciples James and John saw it, they said, "Lord, do you want us to tell fire to come down from heaven and consume them?"

C. The correction via mercy is released (55) - "But He turned and rebuked them."

If we will not show mercy, we should not expect mercy.

D. The need to keep moving forward is clear (56) - "And they went on to another village."
