- A. This was a strange request (14) "Sing aloud, O daughter of Zion; shout, O Israel! Rejoice and exult with all your heart, O daughter of Jerusalem!"

 The first 7 verses of this chapter were an indictment against Israel for their sin, rebellion & coldness against God
- B. This was a surprising revelation (15) "The Lord has taken away the judgments against you; He has cleared away your enemies. The King of Israel, the Lord, is in your midst; you shall never again fear evil."
- C. This was a soothing rest (16) "On that day it shall be said to Jerusalem: "Fear not, O Zion; let not your hands grow weak."

II. An Unexpected Celebration (17)

- A. God initiates the encounter (17a) "The Lord your God is in your midst..."
- B. God works in the encounter (17b) "... a mighty One who will save."
- C. God reveals in the encounter (17c) "He will rejoice over you with gladness ... He will exult over you with loud singing."
- D. God transforms through encounter (17d) "He will quiet you by His love."

III. A Reclaiming Restoration (18-20)

- A. He will change your outlook (18) "I will gather those of you who mourn for the festival, so that you will no longer suffer reproach."
- B. He will put down your opposition (19a) "Behold, at that time I will deal with all your oppressors..."
- C. He will make the last first (19b-20a) "And I will save the lame and gather the outcast, and I will change their shame into praise and renown in all the earth...At that time I will bring you in, at the time when I gather you together; for I will make you renowned and praised among all the peoples of the earth..."
- D. He will erase all your doubt (20b) "...when I restore your fortunes before your eyes," says the Lord."
