I. Enjoying Easy Times with Jesus (10-11)
A. Recounting past blessings to Jesus (10a) - "On their return the apostles told Him all that they had done."
B. Sequestered time alone with Jesus (10b) - "And He took them and withdrew apart to a town called Bethsaida."
C. Learning the wisdom of Jesus (11a) - "When the crowds learned it, they followed Him, and He welcomed them and spoke to them of the kingdom of God..."
D. Experiencing the power of Jesus (11b) - "...and cured those who had need of healing."
II. Entering Intense Times with Jesus (12-14a)
A. Long days of demand (12a) - "Now the day began to wear away, and the twelve came and said to Him..."
B. Heartfelt concerns for people (12b) - "Send the crowd away to go into the surrounding villages and countryside to find lodging and get provisions, for we are here in a desolate place."
C. Daunting expectations from Jesus (13a) - But He said to them, "You give them something to eat."
D. Limited resources to invest (13b-14a) -"We have no more than five loaves and two fish - unless we are to go and buy food for all these people. For there were about five thousand men."
III. Experiencing Enlightening Times with Jesus (14b-17)
A. Learning that He has a plan (14b-15) - "And He said to His disciples, "Have them sit down in groups of about fifty each." And they did so, and had them all sit down." Events belong to God, duty belongs to man - M. Henry
B. Learning to release all you have (16a) - "And taking the five loaves and the two fish, He looked up to heaven and said a blessing over them."
C. Learning what He does with your release (16b) - "Then He broke the loaves and gave them to the disciples to set before the crowd." He takes \& gives back.
D. Learning the ability of God to abundantly supply (17) - "And they all ate and were satisfied. And what was left over was picked up, twelve baskets of broken pieces."
