I. Enjoying Easy Times with Jesus (10-11)

A. Recounting past blessings to Jesus (10a) - "On their return the apostles told Him all that they had done."

B. Sequestered time alone with Jesus (10b) - "And He took them and withdrew apart to a town called Bethsaida."

C. Learning the wisdom of Jesus (11a) - "When the crowds learned it, they followed Him, and He welcomed them and spoke to them of the kingdom of God..."

D. Experiencing the power of Jesus (11b) - "...and <u>cured those who had need of healing</u>."

II. Entering Intense Times with Jesus (12-14a)

A. Long days of demand (12a) - "Now the day began to wear away, and the twelve came and said to Him..."

B. Heartfelt concerns for people (12b) - "Send the crowd away to go into the surrounding villages and countryside to find lodging and get provisions, for we are here in a desolate place."

C. Daunting expectations from Jesus (13a) - But He said to them, "You give them something to eat."

D. Limited resources to invest (13b-14a) -"<u>We have no more than five loaves and two fish</u> - unless we are to go and buy food for all these people. For there were about five thousand men."

III. Experiencing Enlightening Times with Jesus (14b-17)

A. Learning that He has a plan (14b-15) - "And He said to His disciples, "<u>Have them sit down in groups of about fifty</u> <u>each</u>." And they did so, and had them all sit down." Events belong to God, duty belongs to man - M. Henry

B. Learning to release all you have (16a) - "And <u>taking the five loaves and the two fish</u>, He looked up to heaven and said a blessing over them."

C. Learning what He does with your release (16b) - "Then He broke the loaves and gave them to the disciples to set before the crowd." He takes & gives back.

D. Learning the ability of God to abundantly supply (17) - "And they all ate and were satisfied. And what was left over was picked up, twelve baskets of broken pieces." The disciples had a little, the disciples had nothing, the disciples had abundance
