- I. The Constant Heart-Posture of the Christian (10-14)
 - A. Cultivating the highest hunger (10-11) "<u>That I may know Him</u> and the power of <u>His</u> resurrection, and may share <u>His</u> sufferings, <u>becoming like Him</u> in <u>His</u> death, 11 that by any means possible I may attain the resurrection from the dead."
 - B. Refusing to settle prematurely (12-13a) "Not that I have already obtained this or am already perfect, but I press on to make it my own, because Christ Jesus has made me his own. 13 Brothers, I do not consider that I have made it my own. But one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind..."
 - C. Always pressing in for more (13b-14) "...and <u>straining forward</u> to what lies ahead, 14 I <u>press on</u> toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus."
- II. The Determined Mindset of the Christian (15-16)
 - A. Submit your mind (15a) "Let those of us who are mature think this way..." Referring to vs. 10-14
 - B. Open your mind (15b) "...and if in anything you think otherwise, God will reveal that also to you."
 - C. Discipline your mind (16) "Only let us hold true to what we have attained."
- III. The Potential Leaders of the Christian (17-19)
 - A. Those with an authentic testimony (17) "Brothers, join in imitating me, and keep your eyes on those who walk according to the example you have in us."
 - B. Those with an adverse testimony (18-19) "For many, of whom I have often told you and now tell you even with tears, walk as enemies of the cross of Christ. 19 Their end is destruction, their god is their belly, and they glory in their shame, with minds set on earthly things."
- IV. The Unfolding Glory for the Christian (20-21)
 - A. A present belonging (20a) "But our citizenship is in heaven..."
 - B. A promised return (20b) "...and from it we await a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ..."
 - C. A perfect body (21) "Who will <u>transform our lowly body to be like His glorious body</u> by the power that enables him even to subject all things to Himself."
