- I. The Foundation for Our Humility (1)
 - A. Because we have been helped in Christ (1a) "So if there is any encouragement in Christ..."
 - B. Because we have been rescued in loved (1b) "...any comfort from love..."
 - C. Because we are partners with Holy Spirit (1c) "...any participation (koinonia) in the Spirit..."
 - D. Because we have experienced the tenderness of God (1d) "...any affection and sympathy..."
- II. The Outflow of Our Humility (2-4)
 - A. Christians prioritize intentional unity (2) "Complete my joy by being of the same mind, having the same love, being in full accord and of one mind."
 - B. Christians value and honor others (3) "Do <u>nothing</u> from selfish ambition or conceit {our motivation}, but in humility <u>count others more significant than yourselves</u> {our appreciation}."
 - C. Christians pursue practical love (4) "Let <u>each of you</u> look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others." It does not say "Don't take care of yourself." It says, "Make sure to factor in others also."
- III. The Power for Our Humility (5-11)
 - A. We can think like Jesus (5) "Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus..."
 - B. We can empty ourselves like Jesus (6-7) "...who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, 7 but emptied himself by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men."
 - C. We can submit like Jesus (8a) "And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death..."
 - E. We can sacrifice like Jesus (8b) "...even death on a cross..."
 - F. We can prevail like Jesus (9) "Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name..."
 - G. We can wait like Jesus (10-11) "So that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, 11 and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father."
