- I. The Necessary Surrender Before the Battle (30-35)
 - A. Remember the character of your God (30-31) "This God <u>His way is perfect; the word of the LORD proves true; He is a shield for all those who take refuge in Him.</u> 31 For who is God, but the LORD? And who is a rock, except our God?"
 - B. Rest in the resources of your God (32-34) "The God <u>who equipped me with strength</u> and made my way blameless. 33 He made my feet like the feet of a deer and <u>set me secure on the heights</u>. 34 He trains my hands for war, so that my arms can bend a bow of bronze."
 - C. Reflect upon your history with your God (35-36) "You have given me the shield of Your salvation, and Your right hand supported me, and Your gentleness made me great. 36 You gave a wide place for my steps under me, and my feet did not slip." If you do not have much of a history with Him to reflect upon, view this present battle as the invitation to start a history with Him.
- II. The Undeniable Presence During the Battle (37-42)
 - A. God provided power for endurance to David (37-39a) "I <u>pursued my enemies</u> and <u>overtook them</u> and <u>did not turn</u> <u>back</u> until they were consumed. 38 <u>I thrust them through</u>, so that they were not able to rise; they fell under my feet. For <u>You equipped me with strength for the battle."</u>
 - B. God provided seasons of reversal for David (39b-40) "You made those who rise against me sink under me. 40 You made my enemies turn their backs to me, and those who hated me <u>I destroyed</u>."
 - C. God provided clear loyalty to David (41-42) "They cried for help, but there was none to save; they cried to the LORD, but He did not answer them. 42 I beat them fine as dust before the wind; I cast them out like the mire of the streets."
- III. The Song of Praise from the Battle (43-50)
 - A. David's solidified testimony (43-45) "You delivered me from strife with the people; You made me the head of the nations; people whom I had not known served me. 44 As soon as they heard of me, they obeyed me; foreigners came cringing to me. 45 Foreigners lost heart and came trembling out of their fortresses."
 - B. David's enduring humility (46-48) "The Lord lives, and <u>blessed be my Rock, and exalted be the God of my salvation</u> 47 the God who gave me vengeance and subdued peoples under me, 48 who rescued me from my enemies; yes, <u>You exalted me</u> above those who rose against me; <u>You delivered me</u> from the man of violence."
 - C. David's intentional singularity (49-50) "For this I will praise You, O Lord, among the nations, and sing to Your name.

 50 Great salvation He brings to His king, and shows steadfast love to His anointed, to David and his offspring forever."
