<u> Opening passage: John 13:3-17</u>

I. Initiation - Getting started together

A. Accept one another (Romans 15:7) - "Therefore, welcome one another as Christ has welcomed you, for the glory of God."

B. Clothe yourselves in humility toward one another (**1 Peter 5:5**) - "<u>Clothe yourselves, all of you, with humility</u> toward one another, for God opposes the proud but gives grace to the humble."

C. Prefer one another (**Philippians 2:3**) - "Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but <u>in humility count others</u> more significant than yourself."

D. Prioritize oneness with one another (Mark 9:50) - "Be at peace with one another." Romans 12:18 - "If possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all."

II. Edification - Building up one another

A. Encourage and build up one another (1 Thessalonians 5:11) - "Therefore, <u>encourage one another and build one</u> <u>another up</u>, just as you are doing."

B. Serve one another (Galatians 5:13) - "For you were called to freedom, brothers. Only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for the flesh, but <u>through love serve one another</u>."

C. Motivate one another (**Hebrews 10:24-25**) - "And <u>let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works</u>, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, <u>but encouraging one another</u>..."

D. Cultivate the same big-picture with one another (**Romans 12:16, 15:5**) - "Live in harmony with one another. Do not be haughty, but associate with the lowly. Never be wise in your own sight...<u>May the God of endurance and encouragement grant you to live in such harmony with one another</u>, in accord with Christ Jesus, <u>that together you may</u> with one voice glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ."

III. Continuation - When conflict arises

A. Gently, patiently tolerate one another (**Ephesians 4:2**) - "...with all <u>humility</u> and <u>gentleness</u>, with <u>patience</u>, <u>bearing</u> <u>with one another in love</u>."

B. Remain open to one another (**Ephesians 4:32**, **Colossians 3:13**) - "<u>Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving</u> <u>one another...bearing with one another</u> and, if one has a complaint against another, <u>forgiving each other</u>..."

C. Don't complain against one another (James 4:11, 5:9) - "Do not speak evil against one another, brothers."

D. Give preference to one another in honor (**Romans 12:10**) - "...<u>outdo one another</u> in **showing honor**." **Put it on display**
