I. When God Changes Our Circumstances (33-35)

- A. What opposes us will be reversed (33-34) "He turns rivers into a desert, springs of water into thirsty ground, 34 a fruitful land into a salty waste, because of the evil of its inhabitants."
- B. What is required for us will be released (35) "He turns a desert into pools of water, a parched land into springs of water."

II. When God Becomes Our Security (36-38)

- A. God makes a place for us (36) "And there he lets the hungry dwell, and they establish a city to live in;"
- B. God ordains a partnership with us (37) "They sow fields and plant vineyards and get a fruitful yield."
- C. God provides a profit for us (38) "By His blessing they multiply greatly, and He does not let their livestock diminish."

III. When God Overcomes Our Oppressors (39-41)

- A. We cannot deny the reality of trouble (39) "When they are diminished and brought low through oppression, evil, and sorrow..."
- B. We must not forget the promise of deliverance (40) "...He pours contempt on princes and makes them wander in trackless wastes;"
- C. We will not forsake our hope for the future (41) "...but He raises up the needy out of affliction and makes their families like flocks."

IV. When God Reacquaints Us With Certainty (42-43)

- A. Our perception is sharpened (42a) "The upright see it and are glad..."
- B. Our convictions are vindicated (42b) "...and all wickedness shuts its mouth."
- C. Our souls are instructed (43a) "Whoever is wise, let him attend to these things;"
- D. Our hearts are assured (43b) "...let them consider the steadfast love of the LORD."
