- I. We Step Up For the Fight (9)
 - A. Eleazar was an uncommon soldier (9a) "And next to him <u>among the three mighty men was Eleazar</u> the son of Dodo, son of Ahohi."
 - B. Eleazar was an unashamed soldier (9b) "He was <u>with David</u> when <u>they defied the Philistines</u> who were gathered there for battle..." He stayed by the king when the enemy drew near
 - C. Eleazar was a unwavering soldier (9c) "...and <u>the men of Israel withdrew</u>."
- II. We Stand Our Ground In the Fight (10)
 - A. He was engaged in the battle (10a) "He rose and struck down the Philistines..."
 - B. He was exhausted from the battle (10b) "...until his hand was weary..."
 - C. He was enduring in the battle(10c) "...and his hand clung to the sword."
 - D. He was elevated through the battle (10d) "...And <u>the LORD brought about a great victory that day</u>, and <u>the men returned after him only to strip the slain</u>."

God got the glory and others got the spoils from Eleazar's refusal to quit

- III. We See the Value In the Fight (11-12)
 - A. A place of repeated attack (11a) "And next to him was Shammah, the son of Agee the Hararite. <u>The</u> <u>Philistines gathered together at Lehi</u>..."
 - B. A place of hidden value (11b) "...where there was <u>a plot of ground full of lentils</u>..."

Those beans were part of the covenant territory which belonged to Israel. The devil seeks a foothold in one area to create a stronghold for the entire area. If it is valuable enough for the enemy to attack, it is valuable enough for us to defend.

- C. A place to stand alone (11c) "...and the men fled from the Philistines."
- **IV.** We Refuse to Give Up the Fight (12)

"<u>But he took his stand</u> in the midst of the plot and <u>defended it</u> and <u>struck down the Philistines</u>, and <u>the LORD</u> worked a great victory."
