- A. For us to cultivate a listening heart (1a) "Give ear, O My people, to My teaching..."
- B. For us to maintain a receptive heart (1b) "...incline your ears to the words of My mouth."
- C. For us to prioritize a retaining heart (2-3a) "...I will utter dark sayings from of old: things that we have heard and known..."

II. The Privilege God Offers Fathers (3b-5)

- A. A long-standing pattern of influence (3b) "...that our fathers have told us."
- B. A committed continuance (4a) "...we will not hide them from their children..." Deut. 4:9; Deut. 6:6-7
- C. A life-shaping witness (4b-5) "...but <u>tell them to the coming generation</u> the glorious deeds of the Lord, and <u>His might</u>, and <u>the wonders that He has done</u>. 5 He established a testimony in Jacob and appointed a law in Israel, <u>which He</u> commanded our fathers to teach to their children."

III. How God Designs to Use Fathers (6-7)

- A. Generational impartation (6) "That the next generation might know them, the children yet unborn, and arise and tell them to their children."
- B. Generational focus (7a) "So that they should set their hope in God..."
- C. Generational honor of His Word (7b) "...and not forget the works of God, but keep His commandments."

IV. The Cautions God Releases to Fathers (8-11)

- A. Learn from previous generational mistakes (8a) "And that they should not be like their fathers..."
- B. Never quit fighting for your children's souls (8b-10) "...a stubborn and rebellious generation, a generation whose heart was not steadfast, whose spirit was not faithful to God. 9 The Ephraimites, armed with the bow, turned back on the day of battle. 10 They did not keep God's covenant but refused to walk according to his law."
- C. Keep God's ways & works central in your thoughts (11) "They forgot his works and the wonders that he had shown them."
