According to the secular worldview...

- What is the purpose of life?
- What role could suffering play in that purpose?
- What is the appropriate response to suffering?

The Argument against God from Evil

- If God cannot stop evil, then he is not all-powerful.
- If God can prevent evil but does not, then God is not good.
- If God is all-powerful and good, then evil would not exist.
- Evil does exist; therefore, God must not exist.

Defeating the argument against God from evil

- Theodicies
  - o The believer must justify God's ways to the skeptic
  - Soul-Making Theodicy
  - Free Will Theodicy
- Defenses
  - The skeptic must prove his/her case against God
  - One can have the power and desire to act, yet choose *not* to act for good reasons.
  - o Sometimes we inflict short-term harm for long-term good
  - There is no automatic inconsistency between the existence of God and the existence of suffering and evil.



## The visceral argument from evil

- Nazi death camps
  - o Elie Wiezel
  - Victor Frankl
- If there is no God, how does one judge good vs. evil?
- In what way might the existence of evil and suffering in the world actually make the existence of God *more* plausible to us?

## Scripture on Suffering

- Suffering is sometimes justice or judgment
- Suffering is sometimes an injustice
- Suffering is an enemy of God
- God is the Suffering Sovereign
  - The Sovereignty of God
    - Compatibilism God is completely in control over what happens in history and yet
      He exercises that control in such a way that human beings are responsible for their freely chosen actions and the results of those actions.
    - God stands behind good and evil asymmetrically.
  - The Suffering of God in the Old Testament
  - The Suffering of God the Son
- The Final Defeat of Evil
  - o Final judgment
  - o Not only is evil punished, but it will be *undone*.
