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This series in a nutshell: Use your words.

Today's word is sorry.

My definition of sorry: The tool I use to smooth over relational stress

God's definition of sorry: The tool he uses to surgically remove pride from my soul

The Surgical Components of a Sincere Apology

1) Humbly acknowledge that you were wrong

For I know my transgressions, and my sin is always before me. Against you, you only, have I sinned and done what is evil in your sight; so you are right in your verdict and justified when you judge. – Psalm 51:3-4

But I confess my sins; I am deeply sorry for what I have done. – Psalm 38:18

But who can discern their own errors? Forgive my hidden faults. – Psalm 19:12

2) Sincerely ask for forgiveness

Create in me a pure heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me.

– Psalm 51:10

3) Believe that God can and will forgive you

My sacrifice, O God, is a broken spirit; a broken and contrite heart you, God, will not despise. – Psalm 51:17 (see also 1 John 1:9)

4) Tell the story of God's forgiveness

Deliver me from the guilt of bloodshed, O God, you who are God my Savior, and my tongue will sing of your righteousness. Open my lips, Lord, and my mouth will declare your praise. – Psalm 51:14-15

Use your words: Make the ask.

Offer the Gift: Forgiven people forgive people.

Psalm 32:1-7 NEW LIVING TRANSLATION

¹ Oh, what joy for those

whose disobedience is forgiven,

whose sin is put out of sight!

² Yes, what joy for those

whose record the LORD has cleared of guilt,

whose lives are lived in complete honesty!

³ When I refused to confess my sin,

my body wasted away,

and I groaned all day long.

⁴ Day and night your hand of discipline

was heavy on me.

My strength evaporated like water in the summer heat.

⁵ Finally, I confessed all my sins to you

and stopped trying to hide my guilt.

I said to myself, "I will confess my rebellion to the LORD."

And you forgave me! All my guilt is gone.

⁶ Therefore, let all the godly pray to you

while there is still time,

that they may not drown in the floodwaters of judgment.

⁷ For you are my hiding place;

you protect me from trouble.

You surround me with songs of victory.

Next Step: Baptism

5) Read Psalm 32 out loud. How has forgiveness changed your life?
