

Part 3: Seeing Like Jesus

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Today's Main Thing

³⁵ And Jesus went throughout all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom and healing every disease and every affliction. ³⁶ When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. ³⁷ Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; ³⁸ therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest." – Matthew 9:35-38 (ESV)

How Jesus saw people determined how he thought about people, how he felt about people and what he did for people. His caring attitude and action was inspired by his compassionate vision!

Jesus' compassionate vision caused him to live "on the go" so all could know.

"And Jesus went throughout all the cities and villages..." - Matthew 9:35
"For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost." - Luke 19:10

Jesus' compassionate vision came from seeing people as they really are.

"...they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd." - Matthew 9:36

People without Jesus battle 5 Goliath-sized problems:

- 1. Spiritual <u>blindness</u> (2 Corinthians 4:3-4)
- 2. Corrupt leadership and injustice (Proverbs 28:15-16a)
- **3. Debilitating poverty** (Proverbs 19:17; 28:27)
- 4. Life-threatening disease (1 John 3:17-18)
- **5. Life-limiting illiteracy** (Proverbs 3:27)

Jesus' compassionate vision produced practical ministry to them.

He had compassion on them so... he taught in their synagogues, he announced the Good News about the Kingdom and he healed every kind of disease and illness.

"Do not be overcome by evil; but overcome evil with good." - Romans 12:21

"The worst sin towards our fellow creatures is not to hate them, but to be indifferent to them; that is the essence of inhumanity." - George Bernard Shaw

The harvest is more plentiful than it has ever been, but the laborers are few where we need them most!

Jesus is building his church and the gates of hell are not prevailing against it! Nothing and no one can stop the unstoppable Jesus!
