Pick a person... Ecclesiastes 4

Again I looked and saw all the oppression that was taking place under the sun:
I saw the tears of the oppressed—

and they have no comforter; power was on the side of their oppressors and they have no comforter. ² And I declared that the dead.

² And I declared that the dead, who had already died, are happier than the living

are happier than the living, who are still alive. ³ But better than both

is the one who has never been born, who has not seen the evil that is done under the sun.

Person #1: Disillusioned and

<u>devastated</u>

 Again I saw something meaningless under the sun:
 There was a man all alone;

he had neither son nor brother.

There was no end to his toil,
yet his eyes were not content with his
wealth.

"For whom am I toiling," he asked, "and why am I depriving myself of enjoyment?" This too is meaningless—

a miserable business!

Person #2: Successful

...but <u>alone</u> (Proverbs 15:17)

...but <u>dissatisfied</u>

old but foolish king who no longer knows how to heed a warning. ¹⁴ The youth may have come from prison to the kingship, or he may have been born in poverty within his kingdom. ¹⁵ I saw that all who lived and walked under the sun followed the youth, the king's successor. ¹⁶ There was no end to all the people who were before them. But those who came later were not pleased with the successor. This too is meaningless, a chasing after the wind.

Person #4: Popular but guickly
