#### "Worship: A Response to Knowing"

"Worship is the proper response of all moral, sentient (able to perceive or feel things) beings to God, ascribing all honor and worth to their Creator-God precisely because he is worthy, delightfully so. This side of the fall, human worship of God properly responds to the redemptive provisions that God has graciously made. While all true worship is Godcentered, Christian worship is no less Christ-centered. Empowered by the Spirit and in line with the stipulations of the new covenant, it manifests itself in all our living, finding it's impulse in the gospel, which restores our relationship with our Redeemer-God and therefore also with our fellow image bearers, our coworshippers. Such worship therefore manifests itself in both adoration and in action, both in the individual believer and in corporate worship, which is worship offered up in the context of the body of believers." - D.A. Carson

**1 Chronicles 16:29** | "Ascribe to the Lord the glory due his name; bring an offering and come before him! Worship the Lord in the splendor of

holiness, tremble before him all the earth."

Psalm 95: 6-7 | "Come let us bow down in worship, let us kneel before the Lord our Maker; for He is our God and we are the people of his pasture, the flock under his care."

But you shall seek the place that the Lord your God will choose out of all your tribes to put his name and make his habitation there. There you shall go, and there you

shall bring your burnt offerings and sacrifices, your tithe and your contributions, your vow offerings, your free will offering, and the firstborn of your flocks.

And there you shall eat before the Lord your God and shall rejoice, you and your household, in all that you undertake in which the Lord has blessed you. You shall not do according to all that we are doing here today; everyone doing what is right in his own eyes. But you are to go over the Jordan and live in the land that the Lord is giving you to inherit."

A well crafted song, filled with truths about life and God has the power to do that. It grinds biblical truth into our souls, like a pestle grinding powder in a crucible." - Joni Eareckson Tada
