"When I say, 'Presence Problem' I mean the problem of our not engaging or noticing or sensing the presence of God among us!"

Deut 8:1-11 "The whole commandment that | command you today you shall be careful to do, that you may live and multiply, and go in and possess the land that the LORD swore to give to your fathers. ... 7 For the LORD your God is bringing you into a good land, a land of brooks of water, of fountains and springs, flowing out in the valleys and hills, 8 a land of wheat and barley, of vines and fig trees and pomegranates, a land of olive trees and honey, 9 a land in which you will eat bread without scarcity, in which you will lack nothing, a land whose stones are iron, and out of whose hills you can dig copper. 10 And you shall eat and be full, and you shall bless the LORD your God for the good land he has given you.

...Pace has an impact on our "Mindfulness", our "Awareness", our "Engagement" of God Himself

...One Big Thing, Many Things, and the Presence of God

What's the BIG DEAL?

... There is a "Big Deal" in this passage.

Something so central, so important, so relevant to every person that it was "foretold by the mouth of all the prophets"

Isaiah 41:21-26 Set forth your case, says the LORD; bring your proofs, says the King of Jacob.

- Let them bring them, and tell us what is to happen. Tell us the former things, what they are, that we may consider them, that we may know their outcome; or declare to us the things to come.
- ²³ Tell us what is to come hereafter, that we may know that you are gods; do good, or do harm, that we may be dismayed and terrified.
- ²⁴ Behold, you are nothing, and your work is less than nothing; an abomination is he who chooses you.
- ²⁵ I stirred up one from the north, and he has come, from the rising of the sun, and he shall call upon my name; he shall trample on rulers as on mortar, as the potter treads clay.
- ²⁶ Who declared it from the beginning, that we might know, and beforehand, that we might say, "He is right"?
- (v. 26) ...Only the God who knows the very beginning and the very end is qualified to "play God" in our lives and in our world!

Repent therefore, and turn back

— "Repent and turn back" ...THIS is the "Feel" and "Content" of a moment that must find each and every one of us!!

"Too often people are invited to come to Christ and to join the church in such a simplistic way that the process of 'conversion' requires little by way of serious thought, little by way of a call to sacrifice, and little by way of a commitment to serve. Then one wonders why there is so little evidence of transformed lives, families, and communities. ... When Jesus issued the Great Commission, he did not tell his followers to go into all the world and ask people to raise their hands or to fill out a decision card. Rather, he enjoined them to make disciples, baptizing them and teaching them to obey everything he had commanded. This requires an intensive and sustained investment in the lives of disciples, to the end that every aspect of a person's life is supernaturally converted and reoriented in turning to God." Douglas Birdsall (quoted in Turning to God, p. 10)

A Doorway ...Not a Final Destination
