This month we are going to take a look at relationships. The first chapters of Leviticus focus in on our relationship with God and the sacrifices the Israelites were to bring to Him. Throughout the rest of the book we see glimpses of what God instructs and how it invites us to take care of ourselves, reach out to those in need and to be intentional about connecting with those on the margins. I can't wait to see what God has in store for our relationships as we journey through Leviticus this month!

Each session includes (60 – 75 minutes):

- ❖ **Share Time:** An opportunity for people to share where they saw God this week. (7 minutes)
- ❖ **Connection Time:** An activity to grow in relationship with each other. (8 minutes)
- ❖ **Worship:** Songs that speak the truth of the session. (10-15 minutes)
- ❖ **Teaching:** A video clip that dives into the chapter. (15-20 minutes)
- ❖ **Scripture Memory:** Tools to hide the word of God in your heart. (5-7 minutes)
- ❖ **Simple Spiritual Conversation Starters:** Questions that can easily transition to spiritual conversations (10-15 minutes)
- ❖ **Biblical Prayer:** Prompts to pray Scripture back to God (5 minutes)

Lesson #5: Marginalized

What you will need for this lesson:

Setup:

- Have the song videos and teaching videos pulled up on the computer.
- Prepare the tool for memorizing scripture.
- Put a list of past scriptures on the board to go over.
- Print a copy of the daily tools for each attendee.

Curriculum Note: As you walk through each daily tool, have your group write down who or when they could use that tool this week. This curriculum is a call and an expectation of action in this world. Let's equip, empower and encourage each other to live our lives 100% committed to Jesus every day.

Welcome: (Includes Share Time and Fun Friday)

As you start your time together brainstorm and talk about the people in your area or your life that would be considered on the margins. Discuss how you might be able to connect and reach out to them this week.

At Full Send we love to celebrate what God is doing and that is why we want testimony time to be a part of every session. We believe that God has been moving throughout the week and want to celebrate with each other where we saw Him. **Before we start talking about the book of Leviticus let's share what God has been doing in our lives this week!** After a few people have shared praise God for His movement in your lives.

Worship: (Includes Tune In Thursday)

Listening and singing to God is a great way to connect with Him and hear Biblical truths. Encourage your group to either listen or sing along, whatever is best for them. As they engage with each song there will be a few questions to unpack what they heard and experienced.

Word: (Includes Scripture Sunday, Memorize Monday and Watch It Wednesday)

Before we listen to the message from Daniel let's read Leviticus 25

Today we are going to hear from Daniel about our relationship with those on the margins. https://youtu.be/WNg-x_gq5W0

Encourage people to take notes on the back of their sheet of daily tools as they listen to the teaching. **Ask them what stood out to them from the teaching or the scripture.**

Let's memorize Leviticus 25:35 "If your brother becomes poor and cannot maintain himself with you, you shall support him as though he were a stranger and a sojourner, and he shall live with you.

(Memory Verse put to song) – Listen to this first

Today we are going to memorize this verse by alternating words with a partner. Person #1 will say If, Person #2 Your, Person #1 Brother, Person #2 Becomes and so on. Go through this twice word by word and then try phrase by phrase.

Witness: (Includes Table Talk Tuesday)

Now that we have read and studied about our relationship with God ask the group to answer the questions as they would. Then think about how others may answer the questions and how they can turn that into a spiritual conversation.

The questions of the day are: What does forgiveness mean to you? Have you ever had to ask for forgiveness? How did that feel? Did you ever have to extend forgiveness? How did that feel? Did you know Jesus can forgive you? Can I share with you why the forgiveness of Jesus is so important?

As we process these questions, we hope that each person is prepared and equipped to use these questions in normal everyday conversations throughout the week.

Let's read Leviticus 4:27-28

Truth: A sacrifice is needed to cover sin. Jesus is that sacrifice for us!

May this section be an encouragement to those who hear it, and may God fill them with the hope they can have in Jesus Christ.

Closing Prayer: (Includes Seek Him Saturday)

Each week we want to teach people how to pray scripture back to God. Sometimes it is as easy as speaking the text and other times it is using the concepts of the passage to say what is going on in our lives. **Let's finish our day by praying Leviticus 5:14-16. Take some time to confess your sins and ask God if there is anyone that you need to make it right with.**

Encourage the group to come back with stories of what God did this week and how He worked through these daily tools.

Scripture: Leviticus 20 and 25**Topic: Our Relationship With our Those on the Margins****Scripture Sunday:**

Today please join me in the book of Leviticus and read chapters 20 and 25. As you read these chapters how does God instruct the Israelites to treat those who are marginalized?

Memorize Monday:

“If your brother becomes poor and cannot maintain himself with you, you shall support him as though he were a stranger and a sojourner, and he shall live with you. Leviticus 25:35

Table Talk Tuesday:

Talk: What are your thoughts on immigration? What do you think about abortion? How do you think we should treat those who are on the edges in society? Do you know what God thinks about the foreigners, unborn babies and those on the fringes? Can I tell you?

Text: “When a stranger sojourns with you in your land, you shall not do him wrong. You shall treat the stranger who sojourns with you as the native among you, and you shall love him as yourself, for you were strangers in the land of Egypt: I am the Lord your God. Leviticus 19:33-34

Truth: God spent His ministry in the margins and caring for those in need.
