In this five session series on the book of Isaiah we are going to cover the disobedience, consequence, salvation and eternal glory for the people of Israel at that time, but also see how Isaiah was pointing to the coming Messiah and the coming glory for those who believe! We do serve a holy God that demands justice, but also a compassionate God that provides a way out and is calling out to us to turn to Him!

Each session includes (60 – 75 minutes):

- ❖ **Share Time:** An opportunity for people to share where they saw God this week. (7 minutes)
- ❖ **Connection Time:** An activity to grow in relationship with each other. (8 minutes)
- ❖ **Worship:** Songs that speak the truth of the session. (10-15 minutes)
- ❖ **Teaching:** A video clip that dives into the chapter. (10-12 minutes)
- ❖ **Scripture Memory:** Tools to hide the word of God in your heart. (5-7 minutes)
- ❖ **Simple Spiritual Conversation Starters:** Questions that can easily transition to spiritual conversations (10-15 minutes)
- ❖ **Biblical Prayer:** Prompts to pray Scripture back to God (5 minutes)

Lesson #1 Disobedience

What you will need for this lesson:

A few packs of sweet and sour candies like Skittles or gummies.

Setup:

- Have the worship videos and teaching videos pulled up on the computer.
- Prepare the tool for memorizing scripture.
- Put a list of past scriptures on the board to go over.
- Print a copy of the daily tools for each attendee.

Welcome: (Includes Share Time and Fun Friday)

Before class pour the candies into bowls. You can mix them if you want or keep them separate. The goal today is to talk about what we call things. Some things are bitter and some are sweet. Encourage people to describe the flavor of the candy as they eat it. Was it bitter or sour? Notice that nobody lies about what the flavor is, but how often do we do that in our lives?

At Full Send we love to celebrate what God is doing and that is why we want testimony time to be a part of every time we get together. We believe that God has been moving throughout the week and want to celebrate with each other where we saw Him. **Before we start talking about Isaiah let's share what God has been doing in our lives this week!** After a few people have shared praise God for His movement in your lives.

Worship: (Includes Tune In Thursday)

Listening and singing to God is a great way to connect with Him and hear Biblical truths. Encourage your group to either listen or sing along, whatever is best for them. As they engage with each song there will be a few questions to unpack what they heard and experienced.

Word: (Includes Scripture Sunday, Memorize Monday and Watch It Wednesday)

Before we listen to the message from Stacy about Isaiah 1-5 and the disobedience of the people of Israel let's read Isaiah 5:8-30

Today we are going to hear from Stacy Jasper as he helps us focus on what not to do and how to stand for the truth <https://youtu.be/iSWtZVLKNsk>

Encourage people to take notes on the back of their sheet of daily tools as they listen to the teaching. Ask them what stood out to them from the teaching.

What did you hear in the teaching and in the passage we read? What are some things our world calls sweet that are actually bitter?

Moving on let's memorize a passage of scripture today. Print the passage out on 9-10 pieces of paper. Then have 9-10 people stand in a circle and say the words of the person across the circle from them and then the person next to them does the same thing. Continue around the circle until the whole verse is spoken.

Witness: (Includes Table Talk Tuesday)

Now that we have read and studied about disobedience and being filled with the things of this world let's talk about real life situations. Challenge the group to answer the questions as they would, then think about how others may answer the question and how they can turn that into a spiritual conversation.

The question of the day is, do you think that what teachers, parents, bosses say is a suggestion or an expectation? Why? As we process through these questions we hope that each person is prepared and equipped to use these questions in normal everyday conversations throughout the week.

Let's read Isaiah 1:2

God expects His children to be obedient and all that He expects us to do is for our good!

May this section be an encouragement to those who hear it and may the benefits of seeking God be clear!

Closing Prayer: (Includes Seek Him Saturday)

Each week we want to teach people how to pray scripture back to God. Sometimes it is as easy as speaking the text and other times it is using the concepts of the passage to speak what is going on in our lives. **Let's finish our day by praying through Isaiah 2:6-8 confessing for ourselves, our country, our world the things that we have filled our lives with that are not from God.**

Encourage the group to come back with stories of what God did this week and how He worked through these daily tools.

Scripture: Isaiah 1-5

Topic: Disobedience

Scripture Sunday:

Join us today in reading the first 5 chapters of the book of Isaiah. What do you hear from God about His people?

Memorize Monday:

Woe to those who call evil good and good evil, who put darkness for light and light for darkness, who put bitter for sweet and sweet for bitter! Isaiah 5:20
