The greatest villains of scripture are the ones who rebel against Gods word.

Scripture: Genesis 2:4-9; 15-17

God's law is above all! That means that God's word is the ultimate authority.

God established authority to provide peace and order.

Scripture: Genesis 3:1-7

Three Purposes of the Villains of Scripture

- 1. Doubt-"Did God really say?"
- 2. Deception-"You won't die!"
- 3. Destruction

Three institutions and jurisdictions of authority established by God:

- 1. Government authority
- 2. Family authority
- 3. Church authority

Authority is established by God and without it chaos, restlessness, a lack of peace, confusion, and disorder will always follow!

Two Important Questions—To rebel or not rebel?

Question #1 - When do we *not* rebel?

Two Truths about our Sin Nature:

- 1. Our sin nature reflects the very nature of Satan, which is why it must be crucified daily!
- 2. It is within our sin nature to rebel against God, His word, and the authority He has established.

There is never a good time to rebel against scripture; however, there may come a time to rebel against those who demand you to.

When we rebel in an unscriptural manner, we will never reflect God's character accurately.

Question #2 Do we rebel?

Rebellion should never be out of a heart that seeks pleasure to disrupt, but to please God.
