Scripture: Psalm 99 (ESV)

The essential teaching of biblical holiness seems to be <u>uncommon</u> and almost <u>absent</u> in much of the Church today.

In our modern times, biblical holiness can be viewed as <u>ancient</u>, <u>outdated</u> and, in some instances, even flat-out <u>rejected</u>.

However, understanding biblical holiness is crucial to our <u>knowledge</u> of God and how He commands His people to <u>live out their lives</u>.

What does the word "holy" mean?

1. Moral perfection

- He is morally <u>perfect</u>, <u>flawless</u>, and without <u>sin</u>.
- God is without spot, stain, blemish, or wrinkle.
- The holiness of God is what <u>qualifies</u> and <u>conditions</u> all other attributes of God.
- All of God's attributes are <u>perfect!</u>

2. Separate

- God is transcendentally <u>separate</u> <u>uncommon</u>.
- The things of God that are holy are things that are <u>set apart</u>.
 - Holy <u>people</u>
 - Holy place
 - Holy <u>day</u>

What does this knowledge and understanding of a Holy God require of us?

Scripture: Isaiah 6:1-7

- 1. Acknowledge a Holy God
- 2. Accept a Holy God
- 3. Fear of a Holy God
 - We should not just fear <u>punishment</u> for sin but we should desire to <u>submit</u> to God's majesty, authority, and goodness.

Scripture: Revelation 4:6b-11 (ESV)

- When we live in fear of the Holy God, these qualities will mark our lives:
 - o <u>humility</u>
 - obedience
 - o avoidance of evil
 - o faithfulness

The reality of an awesome, <u>uncommon</u>, and <u>Holy God</u> demands the devotion of an <u>uncommon</u> people.

Scriptures: Leviticus 11:45 (ESV); I. Peter 1:13-16 (ESV)

- 1. God's call upon His people is holiness.
 - We live in the world, but we are not <u>of the world</u>—we are <u>separate</u>.
 - God's <u>standard of living</u> for His people is <u>holiness</u>.
 - There is not a more fitting term to describe the essence of holiness than Christlikeness.
 - Jesus Christ is the <u>radiance of God's glory</u>, the <u>exact representation</u> of His being, and the <u>fullness of deity</u> dwells in Him in bodily form.
 - Holiness of life is the <u>will</u> of God, the <u>work</u> of Christ, and the ministry of the <u>Holy Spirit</u>.

Scripture: 2. Corinthians 3:16-18 (ESV); Philippians 2:12-13 (ESV)

- 2. God gives us His <u>Holy Spirit</u> to <u>enable and empower</u> us to live a life of <u>holiness</u>.
 - Holiness of life begins at <u>salvation</u>.
 - Holiness of life is a <u>continuing process</u> of the <u>redemptive power</u> of the <u>grace</u> of God and the <u>Holy Spirit</u>.
