
ACTS #4 - THE WORK OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

Responses to Pentecost

• Acts 2:5 (NIV) — 5 Now there were staying in Jerusalem God-fearing Jews from every nation under heaven.



REACTION: Bewildered Interest

• Acts 2:6 (NIV) — 6 When they heard this sound, a crowd came together in bewilderment, because each one heard them speaking in his own language.

REACTION: Utter Amazement

• Acts 2:7–12 (NIV) — 7 Utterly amazed, they asked: "Are not all these men who are speaking Galileans? 8 Then how is it that each of us hears them in his own native language? 9 Parthians, Medes and Elamites; residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, 10 Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya near Cyrene; visitors from Rome 11 (both Jews and converts to Judaism); Cretans and Arabs—we hear them declaring the wonders of God in our own tongues!" 12 Amazed and perplexed, they asked one another, "What does this mean?"

REACTION: Mocking

• Acts 2:13 (NIV) — 13 Some, however, made fun of them and said, "They have had too much wine."

REACTION: Boldness

• Acts 2:14–21 (NIV) — 14 Then Peter stood up with the Eleven, raised his voice and addressed the crowd: "Fellow Jews and all of you who live in Jerusalem, let me explain this to you; listen carefully to what I say. 15 These men are not drunk, as you suppose. It's only nine in the morning!

• 16 No, this is what was spoken by the prophet Joel: 17 " 'In the last days, God says, I will pour out my Spirit on all people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy, your young men will see visions, your old men will dream dreams. 18 Even on my servants, both men and women, I will pour out my Spirit in those days, and they will prophesy. 19 I will show wonders in the heaven above and signs on the earth below, blood and fire and billows of smoke. 20 The sun will be turned to darkness and the moon to blood before the coming of the great and glorious day of the Lord. 21 And everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.'

REACTION: Unified Support – *They Supported the Testimony of Peter*

• Peter did not stand alone before the crowd. "Then Peter stood up with the Eleven" (Acts 2:14).

The Pattern of Peter's Preaching

- Treat Listeners with Respect.
- Meet Listeners Where They are
- Speak with Authority.

- Spend time with Jesus
- Spend time in God's Word

The Biblical Pattern of a Dynamic Church

• Acts 2:37–47 (NIV) — 37 When the people heard this, they were cut to the heart and said to Peter and the other apostles, "Brothers, what shall we do?" 38 Peter replied, "Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. And you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. 39 The promise is for you and your children and for all who are far off—for all whom the Lord our God will call." 40 With many other words he warned them; and he pleaded with them, "Save yourselves from this corrupt generation." 41 Those who accepted his message were baptized, and about three thousand were added to their number that day.

42 They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer. 43 Everyone was filled with awe, and many wonders and miraculous signs were done by the apostles. 44 All the believers were together and had everything in common. 45 Selling their possessions and goods, they gave to anyone as he had need. 46 Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, 47 praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved.
