Many Jewish Christians had trouble accepting that Gentiles could reach God without traveling that difficult path requiring circumcision, kosher diet, and other Jewish ceremonial laws. - 1. CLEARLY DEFINE THE PROBLEM -Acts 15:5
- 2. HAVE A FULL AND OPEN DISCUSSION OF THE ISSUE -Acts 15:6-7
- 3. LISTEN TO THE EXAMPLE OF GODLY PEOPLE WHOSE PAST WALK WITH GOD GIVES THEM INSIGHT INTO THE PRESENT SITUATION --Acts 15:7-12

- 4. TEST EXPERIENCE WITH THE SCRIPTURES AND MAKE DECISIONS ACCORDING TO THE WORD —Acts 15:13–19
