

Sardis was a "Morgue with a Steeple"

 A Church That Had A Decent Reputation --But One That Jesus Said Was Dead.

• Revelation 3:1–6 (NIV) — 1 "To the angel of the church in Sardis write: These are the words of him who holds the seven spirits of God and the seven stars. I know your deeds; you have a reputation of being alive, but you are dead. 2 Wake up! Strengthen what remains and is about to die, for I have found your deeds unfinished in the sight of my God. 3 Remember, therefore, what you have received and heard; hold it fast, and repent. But if you do not wake up, I will come like a thief, and you will not know at what time I will come to you. 4 Yet you have a few people in Sardis who have not soiled their clothes. They will walk with me, dressed in white, for they are worthy. 5 The one who is victorious will, like them, be dressed in white. I will never blot out the name of that person from the book of life, but will acknowledge that name before my Father and his angels. 6 Whoever has ears, let them hear what the Spirit says to the churches.

1. The City & Church

- Sardis was about thirty miles from Thyatira.
- It was one of the richest cities in the entire world.
- The more wealth it gained, the more greatness it lost.

The Church At Sardis Was Not Threatened By Any Dangers Or Perils.

- It was completely untroubled from without and within.
- The church was at peace, but it was "the peace of the DEAD!"

Live Churches Vs Dead Churches

- Live churches are constantly changing Dead churches won't change
- Live churches have lots of noisy kids Dead churches are quiet.
- Live churches improve for the future Dead churches worship the past.
- Live churches focus on people Dead churches focus on programs.
- Live churches evangelize Dead churches fossilize.

The Difference In Living And Dying Churches Has To Do With The Activity Of The Holy Spirit In The Church

 In Many Christian Circles The Holy Spirit Is Either Neglected, Forgotten, Or Misunderstood.

 The Holy Spirit -- Given To Unite The Body Of Christ -- Is The Center Of Controversy In Many Churches

A Dying Church Needs The Spirit Of God.

• John 16:13 (NIV) — 13 But when he, the Spirit of truth, comes, he will guide you into all the truth. He will not speak on his own; he will speak only what he hears, and he will tell you what is yet to come.

A Dying Church Needs Revival, The Fire Of The Spirit.

• Matthew 3:11 (NIV) — 11 "I baptize you with water for repentance. But after me comes one who is more powerful than I, whose sandals I am not worthy to carry. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire.

A Dying Church Needs The Power Of The Spirit.

• Acts 1:8 (NIV) — 8 But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

- Jesus Has In His Hands What We Need In The Church
- Jesus Offers The Perfect Fullness Of The Holy Spirit.

3. The Circumstances—3:1b

- Revelation 3:1 (NIV) 1 "To the angel of the church in Sardis write: These are the words of him who holds the seven spirits of God and the seven stars. I know your deeds; you have a reputation of being alive, but you are dead.
- The Lord Warns Them, "I Know Your Works."
- They Had A Reputation For Being A Forward Moving Church.
- From The Outside It Looked Like They Had It All Together
- The Sad Truth Is -- It Was Dead

How Could A Church Be Dead Spiritually?

 To Have A Form Of Worship But To Deny The Power Thereof (2 Tim 3:5)

 A Focus On Ritual, Ceremony, & Trappings Of Worship Instead Of A Focus On Christ

Jesus Is Saying: "All Of Your Works Without The Spirit Of God Are Lifeless And Dead."

Spiritual Deadness Effects Our Testimony And Lifestyle

 Let Your Faith Show By What Has Happened On The Inside--Not By What You Are Doing On The Outside

• We Can't Live It If We Aren't Alive On The Inside

4. The Condemnation—3:2, 3

• Revelation 3:1b–3 (NIV) — 1b ... I know your deeds; you have a reputation of being alive, but you are dead. 2 Wake up! Strengthen what remains and is about to die, for I have found your deeds unfinished in the sight of my God. 3 Remember, therefore, what you have received and heard; hold it fast, and repent. But if you do not wake up, I will come like a thief, and you will not know at what time I will come to you.

They Were Going Through The Motions With No Heart For Christ

Christ's Commands Are:

- 1. Wake Up -- Be Alert
- 2. Strengthen What Remains
- 3. Remember The Gospel
- 4. Hold Fast
- 5. Repent (Change Directions)

5. The Commendation—3:4

• Revelation 3:4 (NIV) — 4 Yet you have a few people in Sardis who have not soiled their clothes. They will walk with me, dressed in white, for they are worthy.

6. The Confirmation To Overcomers—3:5

- Revelation 3:5–6 (NIV) 5 The one who is victorious will, like them, be dressed in white. I will never blot out the name of that person from the book of life, but will acknowledge that name before my Father and his angels. 6 Whoever has ears, let them hear what the Spirit says to the churches.
- Dressed In White Means To Be Set Apart For God,
- Your Name Will Not Be Erased From Book Of Life
- He Will Acknowledged You Before The Father & His Angels.
