

## Mark Sayers, Reappearing Church

"Are we punch drunk by the problems of our age, or do we see the opportunities before us? Do we sense the possibilities of embodied and enfleshed Christian community in a time of disembodied isolation?"

"In a time of anxiety and mental exhaustion, are we seeing the rich traditions of prayer, contemplation, and meditation upon God as antidotes to our exhausted brains? In a time of social fracturing and cultural polarization, do we understand the powerful place that exists at the communion table?"

"When His presence comes with power to revive us, be it a personal renewal or a largescale awakening, change occurs at deep levels. Sometimes this occurs in powerful ways, His presence causing people to cry out in conviction (and repentance) during services or display unusual effects of the Spirit's visitation."

"Other renewals are quieter, less obvious, but profoundly change those they touch at the core of their being, the presence moving them to greater levels of Christlikeness."

## "Being in His presence becomes the most important thing."

"God's presence draws close to empower His mission in the world and to reconnect us with our original purpose of spreading His glory to the ends of the earth. When renewal comes, we are empowered in that mission. The years of struggling in our own strength to complete His mission are replaced by a quickening as He becomes our primary power source."

As Stuart Piggin writes, the drawing near of the Holy Spirit in renewal is "to give those gifts which promote the gospel by glorifying Jesus and his kingdom and which empower Christians for the work of evangelism and mission."

"With His Spirit rather than the flesh now empowering our ministry, a holy weight (glory) now pervades our preaching, our evangelism, our teaching, our serving the poor. Breakthroughs become a regular business. What before was a struggle to break up the dirt to plant kingdom seeds now becomes the harvesting of fruit."

"The fruit of the harvest is the transformation of individual lives, communities, cultures, and nations. A beachhead is taken in enemy territory. The strongholds of the enemy are broken, kingdom fruit becomes normal as individual lives, communities, and cultures begin to display the will of God. The work of God advances forward with power."

"We need His **fire** to come, His empowering presence, to do what human strength cannot. We need His fire to come to **cleanse** us and purify us, **accelerate** our ministry and mission.

We need His fire to **smash** strongholds, and to take spiritual ground for the kingdom. Yet we also need His form to **shape us.** We need holy **patterns** to remake us in Christlikeness."



"The twenty-first century has placed the church in the West in a hyperconnected world increasingly experiencing the reality of its flight from God. If we can be a church of fire and form, influential for the kingdom rather than influenced by the world, then we will we find ourselves presented with a phenomenal opportunity. One that should not be met with dismay but anticipation and excitement. The real question is: Are you (we) ready?"
