



5-Day Bible Reading Plan: Living in the Power of the Holy Spirit

Day 1: The Holy Spirit - Your Helper in Weakness

****Reading:** Romans 8:26-27**

****Devotional:****

You were never meant to walk this Christian life in your own strength. Your mind is feeble, your body weak, and your understanding limited. But here's the beautiful truth: at the moment of salvation, God placed His Holy Spirit within you to dwell permanently. The word "dwell" means ownership, home, and intimacy. Holy Spirit doesn't visit occasionally; He lives in you, helping with every infirmity, weakness, and struggle you face. When you feel inadequate, remember you're absolutely right—you are inadequate on your own. But you're never alone. Holy Spirit strengthens your mind to obey, empowers you to walk the narrow path, and provides exactly what you need when you need it. Stop believing satan's lies that you must handle life alone. You have divine help living inside you.

****Reflection Questions:****

- What weakness are you trying to handle in your own strength?
- How can you invite Holy Spirit to help you today?

Day 3: The Teacher of All Truth

****Reading:**** John 14:26; John 15:26-27; John 16:7-8

****Devotional:****

Every spiritual truth you've ever learned came through Holy Spirit's teaching. He is the Spirit of Truth who proceeds directly from the Father, speaking only absolute truth without deceit. This is why salvation is essential for true understanding—the Gospel remains a mystery to unbelievers because they lack the Holy Spirit. But here's the uncomfortable reality many Christians avoid: Holy Spirit not only teaches truth, He reproves sin. The Greek word means to admonish, convict, convince, rebuke, and warn. He doesn't overlook your sin to make you comfortable. He loves you too much for that. Holy Spirit warns you of sin's consequences and rebukes you toward righteousness. The Jesus who said "go and sin no more" is the same Jesus who sent Holy Spirit to convict you. This isn't condemnation—it's love guiding you toward freedom.

****Reflection Questions:****

- Is Holy Spirit convicting you of any sin you've been ignoring?
- Will you respond to His rebuke with repentance?

Day 5: Future Glory and Present Hope

****Reading:** Romans 8:18-25**

****Devotional:****

The sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory that will be revealed. God has secured your future: new heaven, new earth, new body, and eternal presence with Him. But He didn't stop there. Because He loves you so extravagantly, He gave you Himself in the form of Holy Spirit right now. You don't have to wait for heaven to experience God's presence, power, and provision. Holy Spirit dwelling in you is God's down payment on your eternal inheritance. This truth gives you hope that anchors your soul when circumstances overwhelm you. When you don't know where to go or what to do, you have Holy Spirit guiding you into God's perfect will. The choice is yours: will you surrender fully to His leading? Will you respond to His promptings? The time is now. Don't miss out on everything God has for you by trying to navigate life alone.

****Reflection Questions:****

- How does focusing on future glory help you endure present suffering?
- What is one area where you need to surrender control to Holy Spirit today?
