

## 5-Day Devotional: Understanding God's Foreknowledge and Your Divine Purpose

### ## Day 1: Known Before You Were Formed

**\*\*Reading:\*\* Psalm 139:13-16; Jeremiah 1:4-5**

**\*\*Devotional:\*\***

Before God knit you together in your mother's womb, He knew you completely. This isn't about God controlling your choices, but about His infinite knowledge transcending time itself. Your name was written in His book before you took your first breath—not because you had no choice, but because God already knew the choice you would make regarding His Son. This profound truth should bring comfort, not confusion. You are not an accident or an afterthought. God's foreknowledge means He has always seen you, always known you, and has always been working all things together for your good. Today, rest in the reality that you were intentionally created with purpose, and God has known your entire journey from beginning to end.

**\*\*Devotional:\*\***

God's will is crystal clear: He desires that none should perish but that all should come to repentance. This is the filter through which we must understand every difficult theological concept. 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**\*\*Devotional:\*\***

When you accept Jesus, God predestines you to be conformed to the image of His Son. This isn't a one-time event but a lifelong process of sanctification. You are being jointly formed with Christ, fashioned to reflect His character, love, and holiness. This transformation doesn't happen through your own effort—you cannot sanctify yourself. Instead, the Holy Spirit works within you, leading you toward obedience and Christlikeness. This means your daily choices matter. Every moment you yield to the Spirit's prompting, you become more like Jesus. Remember, you are often the first Jesus people encounter. Your life is a living testimony. Allow God to shape you, mold you, and transform you from glory to glory into the image of His beloved Son.

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## ## Day 4: Called, Justified, and Glorified

**\*\*Reading:\*\*** Romans 8:30; Ephesians 1:3-8

**\*\*Devotional:\*\***

Notice the beautiful progression: those God foreknew, He predestined; those He predestined, He called; those He called, He justified; and those He justified, He glorified. This isn't a chain of divine favoritism but a description of God's complete work in every believer. The Holy Spirit constantly calls—to the lost for salvation, to the saved for discipleship. When you respond to that call, God justifies you through Christ's blood. You cannot clean yourself up or make yourself righteous. Only Jesus makes you innocent before God. Then God glorifies you, filling you with His glory so that when the Father looks at you, He sees His Son. You did nothing to earn this; it's all grace. Today, thank God for this complete work He has done in your life.

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**\*\*Devotional:\*\***

Because you are conformed to Christ's image, you become a joint heir with Him—sharing the same legal right to inheritance as Jesus Himself. You are no longer a slave but a son or daughter of the Most High God. This incredible privilege comes with responsibility. As brothers and sisters with Christ, you represent Him to a watching world. Your obedience matters not to earn salvation, but because you are family. Living as a joint heir means walking in the authority, identity, and purpose God has given you. It means suffering with Christ when necessary, knowing you will also be glorified with Him. Today, embrace your identity as God's beloved child. Let this truth shape how you live, love, and serve. You are royalty in God's kingdom—walk worthy of your calling.

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
