



5-Day Bible Reading Plan: Living Without Excuse

Day 1: The Creator Revealed in Creation **Reading:** Psalm 19:1-6; Romans 1:19-20

Devotional:

God's fingerprints cover all creation. From the intricate design of a snowflake to the vastness of galaxies, creation declares His glory. Every sunrise whispers of His faithfulness; every breath testifies to His sustaining power. The invisible God makes Himself visible through what He has made. This leaves humanity without excuse—we can all see evidence of the Creator. Today, pause and observe creation around you. What does it reveal about God's character? His power? His attention to detail? Let creation move your heart from intellectual acknowledgment to worshipful response. Don't just see the creation; see the Creator behind it. Glorify Him as God, giving thanks for His magnificent handiwork that surrounds you daily.

Day 2: The Danger of a Darkened Heart
Reading: Romans 1:21-23; 2 Kings 17:15

Devotional:

Knowing God is not enough—we must glorify Him as God. When we refuse to honor Him or give thanks, our hearts begin a dangerous descent into darkness. We become vain in our imaginations, chasing foolish thoughts while claiming wisdom. This progression is subtle but devastating: ingratitude leads to idolatry, and pride precedes the fall. The Israelites knew this pattern well, yet they followed vanity anyway. Where has ingratitude crept into your life? What imaginations are you chasing instead of Christ? Pride whispers that you're wise enough on your own, but true wisdom begins with fearing the Lord. Today, confess any pride or ingratitude. Ask God to illuminate the dark corners of your heart and restore thankfulness for who He is.

| ## Day 3: Killing Idols, Choosing God |

| **Reading:** Exodus 20:3-6; Colossians 1:15-18 |
| **Devotional:** |
| Idols are anything we glorify above God—phones, success, relationships, entertainment, even ministry. We exchange the glory of the incorruptible God for corruptible substitutes that can never satisfy. These idols seem harmless until we realize they've displaced God from His rightfu throne in our hearts. Christ must have preeminence in all things. He is the image of the invisible God, the Creator of all, and nothing should rival Him. What competes for God's place in your life? What do you turn to before turning to Him? Identify your idols honestly. The world pushes idolatry constantly, making it feel normal, but God calls you to be set apart. Kill your idols through confession and repentance. Choose today to worship the Creator alone, giving Him the glory only He deserves. |

| ## Day 4: Set Apart and Sanctified **Reading:** 1 Peter 1:13-16; Romans 12:1-2 |
| **Devotional:** As God's children, we are called to be holy because He is holy. Salvation is not a license to continue in sin but a transformation that demands obedience. You are set apart—sanctified—for God's purposes. This means rejecting the world's patterns and refusing to conform to your old self. The battle is won or lost in your mind and heart before it ever shows in your actions. You cannot stay set apart while running back to worldly ways or justifying wickedness in your heart. God's love compels Him to warn you: living in unrepentant sin has eternal consequences. Don't chase your imaginations; chase Jesus. Present yourself as a living sacrifice. Renew your mind daily through God's Word. Live differently because you are different—redeemed, renewed, and restored for eternity. |

Day 5: Without Excuse, With Great Hope
Reading: Romans 1:16-20; Acts 10:34-35

Devotional:

God is no respecter of persons. It doesn't matter if you're rich or poor, powerful or common—what matters is whether you're covered by the blood of Jesus. Through creation and His Word, God has made Himself known, leaving no one without excuse. Yet His warnings come from love. He doesn't want anyone to perish but desires all to come to repentance. If you've rejected Jesus, today is your day to change that. If you've been living in compromise, today is your day to return. God's gospel is power unto salvation for everyone who believes. You have direct access to the Father through Jesus and the indwelling Holy Spirit who leads, convicts, and transforms you. Don't make excuses. Respond to His love with confession, belief, and obedience. Your eternity depends on it.
