5-Day Bible Reading Plan: Saved By Faith Alone

Day 1: No Room for Pride

****Reading:**** Ephesians 2:8-10

****Devotional:****

Salvation is God's gift, not our achievement. When we truly grasp that we are saved by grace through faith, pride has no place in our hearts. We cannot boast about our goodness or accomplishments before God. This truth should humble us deeply. The moment we think we have earned God's favor, we miss the entire gospel. Yet this same passage reminds us we are His workmanship, created for good works He prepared in advance. Our works flow from salvation, not toward it. Today, examine your heart. Are you trying to earn what has already been freely given? Surrender your pride and rest in His grace.

Day 2: Exalting God's Work

****Reading:**** Luke 8:26-39

****Devotional:****

The demon-possessed man wanted to follow Jesus physically, but Jesus sent him home with a mission: tell everyone what God has done for you. This is our calling too. We have been delivered from sin's bondage, set free from death's grip, and given new life. This is not our doing but God's mighty work. When we say "I got this," we subtly steal glory from God. Instead, we must proclaim "God has this in me." Your testimony is powerful because it points others to the Deliverer, not the delivered. Today, share with someone the great things God has done in your life. Make it about Him, not you.

You are not a sinner saved by grace; you are a saint who will sometimes sin. This distinction matters profoundly. When you placed faith in Christ, you became a new creation. Old things passed away; everything became new. Your identity changed from sinner to child of God. Yes, you will still struggle with sin, but it no longer defines you. Christ defines you. You have been reconciled to God and given the ministry of reconciliation. Today, reject the lie that you are still a sinner. Embrace your new identity in Christ. Walk as the new creation you are, not as the old person you were.
