PRAYER GUIDE

July 1, 2020

"The Lord is near to all who call on Him, to all who call on Him in truth. He fulfills the desire of those who fear Him; He also hears their cry and saves them. The Lord preserves all who love Him." Psalm 145: 18-20

PRAYERS FOR THE KINGDOM AND MISSIONS

Wayne & Ann Curles in Burma: "We are very concerned about our Burmese friends. The health care system and lack of hospitals in Burma will insure that only the government leaders and wealthy people will be able to actually get the needed health care if they contract the virus. We are facing a very dire situation. No one knows what the future will hold for us, but we know that nothing shall separate us from the love of God: not trouble or persecution or famine or nakedness or danger or sword. (Rom. 8:35) Please continue to pray for us.'

Church in our Presbytery: Pray for Grace Fellowship Presbyterian Church in Albertville and their pastors, Jackie Gaston and Caleb Ehmke.

One Supported Ministry: Pray for RUF at the Washington University of St. Louis, Missouri. Pray for their campus staff worker. Kristen Thompson.

PRAYERS FOR THE CHURCH

Pray people will watch our services online that would not tune in

normally. Pray they might be brought to faith or new growth in Christ. Spiritual Life: Pray for the general prayer life of our church. Pray for the preaching and teaching of God's word on the Lord's Day. Pray for the spiritual development, wisdom, and maturity of our elders and deacons. Pray that we might grow in grace during this uncertain time.

WIC: Pray for Keller Thompson, Historian of the WIC.

Youth: Pray for our covenant children. Pray for Corey Lanier as he leads our youth ministry, especially as they meet outdoors on Wednesday evening. Pray for the little children to continue to learn their lessons from home. PRAYERS FOR OUR SPIRITUAL WELL BEING AND GROWTH

For the next few weeks we are going to focus our prayers on the seven-fold petition we introduced last week. I would like to challenge you to prayer for these seven things during the week, maybe even one each day: Joy: so often we get joy from our friends and community connections; ask God to fill in the gaps this dark providence has given us. Influence: pray that Christians can have more positive influence in our families, communities, and nation, particularly through the power of the gospel preached and shared. Patience: ask the Lord to help you cope with this new world we are living in and the people in it who can rub us the wrong way. Hope: pray for this fundamental grace of the Christian life in this dark time, that God will hear our prayers and that either here or in heaven, he will bring us through. Unity: pray we do not become critical or condescending because of our disagreement with one another about attending church, personal protection, gathering in groups, or all the politics surrounding this time. Growth: pray that we are able to find ways to grow in grace, even when our personal attendance at the meetings of the church is less than before. Fay you may be more diligent in your private graces than ever. Safety: pray that we may be protected from illness, violence, and fear.
