PRAYERS FOR THE KINGDOM AND MISSIONS

RUF at Mississippi State University: "As the Covid-19 pandemic spread, we continued meeting as RUF offered four virtual community groups that were led by students. There were also game nights, hymn sings. RUF staff continued to provide one-on-one ministry to students via Zoom and FaceTime. Elliott Everitt, former campus minister at MSU received a call from a church and will not be with us in the Fall. The new campus minister will arrive on campus in the Spring semester. Interns Grant and Anne Michal Carter will have an expanded role at MSU until then. Continue to pray for the ministry at MSU. There is much work to be done and many opportunities to do it."

Church in our Presbytery: Pray for Valley Presbyterian Church in Madison, a growing church in the middle of a growing area. Pray for their pastors, Will Plott, Barney Heyward, and James Hollis.

One Supported Ministry: Pray for Consulting Service Foundation led by Bebo Elkin. Pray for Bebo and Wayne Herring as they mentor young seminarians, help hurting churches, and link empty pulpits and pastors together.

Other Kingdom Concerns: Ask the Lord to put a missionary, church, or gospel ministry on your heart to pray for during the week.

PRAYERS FOR THE CHURCH

Sunday School Communities: Pray for the Men's Sunday school community led by Hal Hughston and Lee Hudson. Pray this group will continue to keep connected during this crisis.

PRAYERS FOR OUR SPIRITUAL WELL BEING AND GROWTH

For the next few weeks we are going to focus our prayers on the seven-fold petition we introduced last week. I would like to challenge you to prayer for these seven things during the week, maybe even one each day: Joy: so often we get joy from our friends and community connections; ask God to fill in the gaps this dark providence has given us. Influence: pray that Christians can have more positive influence in our families, communities, and nation, particularly through the power of the gospel preached and shared. Patience: ask the Lord to help you cope with this new world we are living in and the people in it who can rub us the wrong way. Hope: pray for this fundamental grace of the Christian life in this dark time, that God will hear our prayers and that either here or in heaven, he will bring us through. Unity: pray we do not become critical or condescending because of our disagreement with one another about attending church, personal protection, gathering in groups, or all the politics surrounding this time. Growth: pray that we are able to find ways to grow in grace, even when our personal attendance at the meetings of the church is less than before. Safety: pray that we may be protected from illness, violence, and fear.

Mike Bishop: will have surgery on his head this week or the next. He will have an MRI before the surgery to see if the cancer has possibly spread.

Virginia Minetree (Sr.): has been diagnosed with "wet" macular degeneration, meaning there is some bleeding in the back of her eye. Jan Stubblefield: "On Wednesday, August 5, she will have surgery at UAB in Birmingham, Alabama, to remove cancerous spots on her gums and tongue. This would dramatically change the course of surgery as well as her recovery, side effects, and quality of life. She is expected to stay in the hospital for a minimum of 7 days."
