# Announcements for March 27 - April 2, 2022

A note from your Pastor...

Hello Highlanders,

This week, as we continue to journey through Lent together, we have been finalizing details for our special worship services during Holy Week. I am really excited about all that we have planned for that week. As such, I wanted to take a moment now to share with you a little 'preview' of those services, and hopefully nudge you to make joining us for some or all of them a priority. The services that take place during Holy week are some of the most powerful, and unique in our faith tradition. They are also some of my personal favorites!

The Sunday before Easter is unique in our church calendar because it is one day with two very different focus points. That day is both Palm Sunday - a time to mark the joyous, triumphant entry of Jesus into Jerusalem usually marked with sung 'hosanna's and waving palm branches', and it is also Passion Sunday - where, in the last Sunday before Easter, we mark and remember Christ's passion or sacrifice of love for all of us.

The two ideas can make for a strange combination - one joyous, one decidedly heavier - but both are critical parts of our journey to the empty tomb at Easter. We can't fully appreciate the passion and sacrifice of Jesus if we don't mark the king's welcome that he received upon entering Jerusalem, just days before his arrest and crucifixion. Likewise, we won't be able to fully experience the joy of Easter morning without walking through the events of Maundy Thursday and Good Friday.

This year, as we attempt to weave both of these themes together, we will do so by borrowing a page from the Christmas season. So, at both our services on April 10th, we will have Palm and Passion Sunday version of a 'lessons and carols' service. The traditional lessons and carols service weaves beloved songs together with the story of Christ's birth. Our service that day will marry together the account of Jesus' passion - beginning with his triumphant entry - from the gospel of Matthew, with powerful songs and hymns reflective of the season. We hope you will join us. On Maundy Thursday, we will have special service where we will remember the events that took place in the upper room with Jesus and his disciples. This service, held in the fellowship hall at 6:00pm, will include footwashing and communion and will engage us in the powerful events of that night.

Finally, we will have a Good Friday Tenebrae at 7:00pm in the Chapel. Tenebrae means shadows, and this framatic service of music and readings is intermixed a darkening of the sanctuary and a reflection on Christ's loving sacrifice for us. I hope you will plan now to join us at these special services during Holy Week.
