### Music Notes from Pam...

"O Come, O Come, Emmanuel" is our opening hymn on the second Sunday of Advent. This hymn, originally composed in Latin, is one of the oldest in any hymnal. The tune originated in 15th century France, while the lyrics are part of the "O Antiphons" from 6th century Italy. The lyrics are far removed from joyful celebrations of Christmas. When we sing this song, we put ourselves in the place of "captive Israel, that mourns in lonely exile here."

The organ prelude is based on this tune (VENI EMMANUEL) and is quite mournful compared to the preludes we are accustomed to hearing. A piano postlude arrangement of "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel" will be played by Harriet McDonald. As we leave the sanctuary to continue our journey through Advent towards the celebration of Christ's birth, may this song echo
