A note from your Pastor...

Hello Highlanders,

I don't know about you, but I have had the Christmas music on at every opportunity for a couple weeks now and I am definitely getting into the spirit of the season...I found myself aimlessly singing 'it's the hap, happiest time of the year...' as I sat down at my desk this morning. Thankfully there was no one near enough to be subjected to my singing!

That sentiment, that it's the happiest time of the year, is one that I think most of us believe is how we are 'supposed' to feel during the Christmas season. Sometimes we do - and that is wonderful - but there are other times, because of life circumstances, a bad night sleep, or any number of other reasons, when those words would ring hollow were we to say them.

Too often we think that these less festive feelings and emotions are somehow invalid, or even unfaithful, especially at this time of year. But in reality, these feelings are an unavoidable part of life and our living in a broken world. And more than that, they are exactly why Christ came at Christmas.

Christ, the light of the world, came into the world because of the darkness that only he could overcome. Acknowledging that we don't always feel like it is the 'happiest time of the year' is not some failure of our faith and it doesn't mean we are Scrooge or the Grinch, it just means that we are experiencing a moment of awareness about how much our world - and how much we - need Jesus.

Thinking of Christmas songs, not all of them are quite as saccharine as 'It's the most wonderful time of the year'. This week I read an article talking about the importance of sad songs, especially at Christmas. The author said, 'Sad songs are important to us, working against our tendency toward unrealistic exuberance. They feel true-to-life rather than packaged in sparkly paper. Sad Christmas songs counterbalance the merriment and revelry the holiday season tends to induce. Even the contemplative "Silent Night" helps us deal with hyperactive numbers like "We Wish You a Merry Christmas" and "Rudolph the Red-Nosed Reindeer."

Emmanuel means that God is with us. It doesn't mean that the world is perfect or that everything is always wonderful, but it does mean that good or bad, happy or sad we are never alone. It means that we can trust that in the darkest of nights, the dawn is coming. It is precisely because of Jesus that we don't have to pretend that everything is perfect. Because of Jesus, no matter the circumstance we can say with hope and confidence that 'it is well'.
