

Notes on Today's Music...

"Come, Ye Sinners, Poor and Needy" is an 1844 American shape note tune, and was included in the 2013 Presbyterian Hymnal. In this Gordon Young prelude, the melody is played on the pedals.

"In His Presence" is one of five new introits the Chancel Choir has been preparing for worship. We are excited to have Bob Matlack sing the opening solo part.

"Immortal, Invisible" is a hymn of praise inspired by the three divine attributes listed in 1 Timothy 1:17, and it considers how God's presence exceeds our own earthly years. It is sung to a Welsh folk melody adapted for congregational singing in 1839.

"Almighty Father" by Benjamin Harlan is a Chancel Choir favorite. The words are a beautiful declaration of trust and hope. "You are a tower, a mighty Fortress, You are my strength and shield. You are God."

"How Great Thou Art" was written first in Swedish, was translated into German, and then into Russian before reaching its English form. Don Latella will sing this well-loved song of faith that is a meaningful source of comfort to many people.

"O Love, That Wilt Not Let Me Go" is a poignant hymn to God addressed as Love, Light, and Joy. Written in 1882 by a blind minister during a time of deep personal suffering, it continues to be a powerful hymn of commitment for us today.
