A note from your Pastor...

Hello Highlanders,

As I write to you this week, we are in the midst of preparing our HPC annual report for our annual congregational meeting. The meeting, which I hope all of you will make plans to attend will be held in the sanctuary next Sunday, February 13th @10:30am. We know that this time means we are asking you to end Sunday school early, but this is an important meeting, and we want to include everyone from both of our worship services and make sure everything starts on time.

You may wonder what the point or reason for an annual meeting is? It is a fair question. At our annual meeting several things will happen, some that are mandated either by our PC(USA) book of order or the laws of the state of North Carolina. The state requires that we have a meeting of the corporation on a yearly basis, and so this will happen as a part of our meeting. The congregation will receive our annual report, which includes information about all that we have done and experienced in the last year, as well as our financial information from 2021 and the budget for 2022. The budget is presented to the congregation for information, as the session is the one who approves the budget. The congregation will, however, vote on the terms of call for your pastor - as that is something that can only be approved during a congregational meeting.

But more than these, mostly transactional actions, our annual meeting is important because it is a reminder that we are one body - connected together in and through Jesus Christ. In our Presbyterian system of governance, we operate under a 'representative democracy'. Each year, at a different congregational meeting, you - the congregation - elect elders to serve a term as active elders on the session. The session, much like congress in our national system or city council locally, is empowered to make the decisions about running the church and setting our missional direction.

But they are doing that for all of us. And in our annual meeting it is a time to reflect on that work, and remember that 'the church' doesn't make decisions in our system - the members of the congregation through the session - do. Wherever we go as Highland Presbyterian Church we go together, and this meeting is a chance to make sure you know where we are headed. I hope to see you there.
