NOTES on TODAY'S MUSIC...

Opening Hymn: "Praise My Soul, the King of Heaven" is a paraphrase of Psalm 103 set to the tune LAUDA ANIMA. May we joyfully sing this triumphant hymn of praise: "Ransomed, healed, restored, forgiven, evermore His praises sing." As we give breath to Henry Lyte's 1834 text, may we be inspired by both the beautiful imagery in the poetic words and the majesty of the music of John Goss written in 1868.

Song: "The Blessing" will be our song of dedication for the Blessing of the Backpacks this Sunday as our children begin a new school year. The lyrics are taken from the priestly blessing found in Numbers 6:22-27, and we gladly welcome the musical gifts of Kristin and Kelsey McCarthy to traditional worship this week.
