

Notes on Today's Music...

Prelude and Offertory... This Sunday Andrea Kelly will be playing Bach arrangements for flute during the prelude and offertory: "Sinfonia" from Cantata no. 156 and "Aria" from Cantata no. 208. She is a huge blessing to Highland as she gives her musical gifts through Chancel Choir, Highland Ringers, and instrumental worship music.

Choral anthems... "The First Song of Isaiah" is a favorite of Highland and is today's anthem. On Nov. 13th an a cappella version of "Keep Your Lamps!" will be accompanied by percussionist Sue Hardwick on conga. The Chancel Choir is preparing "Come Thou Fount" by Hal Hopson for Nov. 20 and an Advent anthem "Prepare the Way" for Nov. 27.

Hymns..."To God Be the Glory" is an exuberant expression of gratitude to God as creator of the universe. May we sing this gospel song with joy as worship begins with voices lifted in praise! "Go With Us, Lord" is a Reformation Era hymn that was introduced last Sunday as a closing prayer and postlude. Today it will be sung first by the choir, and then by the congregation.
