NOTES on TODAY'S MUSIC...

Prelude: "Come, Thou Almighty King" is an arrangement of a hymn that addresses each Person of the Trinity in turn and ends with a request that "His sovereign majesty may we in glory see." Composer Gordon Young (1919-1998) was organist/choirmaster of First Presbyterian Church, Detroit MI. May the trills and bold chords in his inspired composition compel us to worship!

Opening Hymn: "Joyful, Joyful We Adore Thee" is a beautiful hymn of praise to God from all of creation. The text expresses both the joy given to God by His creation and the joy we receive through His creation. It calls us to live out this joy in love of one another. The tune HYMN TO JOY is the adaptation of Beethoven's famous final movement in his Ninth Symphony.

Anthem: "O Love of God, Most Full" shares the same tune as "Breathe on Me, Breath of God." The 1878 tune TRENTHAM was written by Robert Jackson in the tradition of Victorian hymnody. Three decades ago composer Ken Denton created this poignant setting for choir and organ that will be conducted this morning by Richard Butler.

Offertory: "We Are One in the Spirit" or "They'll Know We Are Christians by Our Love" is perfect for today's service. When I looked it up in our hymnal, it was disappointing to find it was not there. Chris messaged the following day to say it would be his first choice for the closing hymn! We will be introduced to it by hearing an organ arrangement of this very singable tune.

Closing Hymn: The first verse of "They'll Know We Are Christians by Our Love" will be sung by a soloist, the second by the Chancel Choir, and the third by the congregation. If you don't feel comfortable with it yet, you can meditate on the third verse that is printed in the bulletin as we join together in singing to the Lord a new song!

Postlude: "Blest Be the Tie That Binds" was first titled "Brotherly Love." John Fawcett wrote this hymn in 1772 to be sung by his congregation at the conclusion of one of his sermons on Christian unity. May this congregation be bound together by love as we go forth in peace to love and serve in the coming week.


