Notes on Today's Music...

Today's opening hymn "Come Thou Fount of Every Blessing" is one of the most well-known and loved hymns in all of church history. It can be found in 2,183 hymnals and is set to various tunes. In American hymnals NETTLETON is the most common tune, and in the United Kingdom WARRENTON is the preferred tune. In our hymnal the text is printed without the tune, so if you like to sing something other than the melody you'll need to refer to the score on the facing page.

In 1752, when George Robinson was 17, he attended an evangelical meeting intending to heckle believers, but instead listened to the message of the great preacher George Whitefield. It moved him deeply and made him rethink how he was living his life. In 1858, while preparing to preach his own sermon, he penned the words to this hymn. The first stanza is praise and adoration, and the last two are more of a spiritual autobiography.

Robinson used language that is unfamiliar today. "Ebenezer" is a reference from I Samuel 7:12 in which the prophet raised a monument to commemorate the victory God gave to Israel. In Hebrew, Ebenezer means "stone of help" (eben = stone; ezer = help). When we sing "Here I raise my Ebenezer" we are quoting Samuel who raised the Ebenezer stone to remind the Israelites of God's help.

May these beautiful truths, written hundreds of years ago, give voice to our praise and continue to bring hope to our weary souls. "Here's my heart, Lord, take and seal it, seal it for Thy courts above."

Hello Highlanders,

As many of you know my family, a few other HPC youth, and I will be heading to Westminster College on Thursday for the annual New Wilmington Mission Conference. Our family has gone every year and it is where Traci and I met.

Like many family traditions, whether or not we are going to the conference is not really a question - everyone just knows that it is on the schedule. These family traditions, whatever they are, become important parts of what shapes a family. The regular events and patterns that our families create and illuminate what our values are and what motivates us.

The mission conference is a place where God has shown up and moved in people's lives for 120 years, in large part because each year the people coming arrive seeking the Word, the heart, and the leading of God.

In the same way, God can continue to speak and guide us, helping us grow and learn as we return to scripture passages and Bible stories that we already know so well. When we come with open hearts, willing to be led by God's Holy Spirit - whether at a conference, in our daily devotional reading, or in worship - God never disappoints and will always lead us into growth and new understanding.

So, no matter where you find yourself this week, I invite you to be open to the leading and the teaching of God's Holy Spirit.
